In Episode 1, Quigon Jinn's personal communicator is actually a resin cast of a Gillette Ladies Sensor Excell Razor.


4. Ewoks speak Tibetan

Praying can really help. Pray for your siblings to stop bugging you right now and pray that you won't lash out at them when they do.





Who was Martin Luther?

Important people in the history of Christianity.



Martin Luther was born in Eisleben (120 miles southwest of today's Berlin) to Margaret and Hans Luther in 1483. He was raised in Mansfield, where his father worked mining copper. Martin went to Latin school, and then, when he was 13, to the University of Erfurt to study Law. That's pretty young! I'm 13!!! There, Luther earned both a baccalaureate and master's degree in the shortest time possible. He was so skilled at his studies that he was nicknamed "the philosopher".

Then, in 1505, his life turned upside down. As the

21 year old Luther was walking through a thunderstorm of the road to Erfurt, a lightning bolt struck the ground near him. "Help me, St. Anne!" Luther yelled, "I will become a monk!". Luther lived, and acknowledging his vow, gave away all his possessions and became a monk.

Luther was actually an extraordinarily successful monk. He later commented that "if anyone could have earned heaven by the life of a monk, it was I". Though he sought by the means of being a good monk and loving God to earn his way to heaven, he was still terrified of the wrath of God. Luther remarked "I hated that word, 'the righteousness of God,' by which I had been taught according to the custom and use of all teachers ... [that] God is righteous and punishes the unrighteous sinner". The young Luther knew that he could not live by faith because he wasn't righteous.

On All Saints' Eve in 1517, Luther publicly objected to the selling of indulgences. Indulgences were little strips of paper that people bought from the church in order to supposedly release the dead of the punishment due to them by their sins. As one priest preached: "Once the coin into the coffer clings, a soul from purgatory heavenward springs!". Luther called for a public debate about the topic of indulgences when he nailed 95 theses to the church door. But, his 95 theses spread around Germany and the topic

became: did the pope have the right to issue indulgences? At a public debate in Leipzig in 1519, Luther was threatened with excommunication.

In 1521, Luther was called to an assembly in Worms, Germany, to appear before the Holy Roman Emperor. Luther prepared for another debate, but discovered that it was a trial at which he was told to recant his views. Luther replied: "Unless I can be instructed and convinced with evidence from the Holy Scriptures or with open, clear, and distinct grounds of reasoning ... then I cannot and will not recant, because it is neither safe nor wise to act against conscience." Then he added, "Here I stand. I can do no other. God help me! Amen". Luther then hid in Wartburg Castle for ten months.

In the early spring of 1522, Luther was able to return to Wittenburg with the help of men from the fledgling reform movement. Over the next few years, Luther entered into more and more disputes. He married a runaway nun named Katharina von Bora. He mocked fellow reformers, especially Swiss reformer Ulrich Zwingli. Martin Luther's final years were spent in sickness and vigorous activity. For example, in 1531, although he suffered from exhaustion and was sick for 6 months, he still preached 180 sermons, wrote 15 tracts, worked on his Old testament translation, and went on multiple trips. Martin Luther passed away in 1546, ending a long legacy that inspired many reformers, and was key in the Reformation.


